Dear Parent/Carer

As you know, your child is now at the stage of their education where they have the opportunity to have a direct say in what they study for the next two years through choosing their option subjects. The decisions they make now can have an effect on decisions they can make later as sixteen year olds – attending Sixth Form, starting employment, taking up training or going to college. It is very important, therefore, that they choose wisely and leave themselves as many avenues open as possible for the future. To help them do this, and to help you support them we have set up a programme of events this term and next term.

To begin the process, all Year 9 students have had the options process explained to them in an assembly on October 10th. The key points of this information are the time line of events, and what choices they have. The information below shows the timeline of events in place to help guide students:

In terms of what students can choose to study, all students must study the core curriculum in English Language, English Literature, Mathematics, Science, Beliefs and Values and Physical Education.

In addition to the core curriculum all students **must choose at least one EBacc subject**. The choices are: a Humanities (History or Geography), or a Modern Foreign Language (French or German) or Computer Science. In addition to the core curriculum and the EBacc subject all students must make **a further three choices**. Students can choose to study additional EBacc subjects or choose to pursue non-EBacc subjects.

Initially, there is a free choice of options (the straw poll). This will enable us to "block" the option subjects so they can be timetabled, and so that the maximum number of students can get their preferred option course combinations. The final options form will require students to pick one course from each "block". The option subjects currently are:

EBACC Subjects (at least one must be taken) NON-EBACC Subjects

Computer Science 3D Design*

French Art*
Geography Business Studies

German Catering
History Construction

Science (Triple) Drama

Media Studies Music

Resistant Materials

Sports Science

*NB Art and 3D design cannot both be chosen

As you can see from the timeline above, options forms will be gathered on February 26th, so there is plenty of time for the students to think about the choices and get advice. After this date the choices of the whole year group will be collated, and carefully analysed to ensure each student has appropriate options. Please be aware that all option choices are subject to timetable and staffing constraints. If there is a problem with a particular option subject we will inform parents and students as soon as possible. Equally, if a new course becomes available this information will be communicated at the first possible opportunity
