<p><u>Flash Fiction</u> Focus on creative writing in response to variety of stimuli, under timed conditions, building skills needed for GCSE Language. Students also analyse 'flash fiction' from other contemporary and literary heritage writers</p>	<p><u>Rhetoric:</u> Speeches from Shakespeare's 'Henry V', 'Julius Caesar', 'Merchant of Venice' PLUS – range of non-fiction speeches eg Obama, Martin Luther King.</p>	<p><u>Cultures:</u> SMSC focus and language change. Focus on what makes us 'British' and where our ideas about 'Britishness' stem from. Analysis to include: C19 non-fiction C19 lit non-fiction C20 non-fiction (immigration, riots)</p>	<p><u>Place Poetry</u> A selection of poems from the outgoing GCSE cluster including some 19th century poems.</p>	<p><u>Of Mice and Men/Novel</u> Links to 19th century non-fiction to be made as part of the scheme. W: Write an 'Epilogue' – using a character returning to a key 'setting' (scene/place).</p>
